

**NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER  
SECTION 53 OF THE WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**The Oxfordshire County Council  
Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for Oxfordshire  
Watlington Footpath No. 36 Modification Order 2019**

The above Order made on 19 December 2019, if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by: -

*Adding to them the footpath from Watlington Footpath No. 27 at St Leonard's Church car park at grid reference SP 6848 9469 running in a generally south-easterly, easterly, then north-easterly direction for approximately 101 metres to a point situated at grid reference SP 6857 9471 then turning to run in a generally south-easterly direction where it crosses a stream, continuing for approximately 60 metres to a junction with Watlington Footpath No. 27 at Church Meadow at grid reference SP 6860 9466.*

If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
