

NOTICE OF MAKING OF ORDER
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND
DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER
TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990, SECTION 257,
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

**Town and Country Planning Act 1990 Section 257,
The Oxfordshire County Council Ardley Bridleway No 27 (part),
Public Path Diversion and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2021**

The Order, made on 18th January 2021, if confirmed as made will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by diverting 760m of Ardley Br 27 that runs from east of the B430 opposite its junction with the Upper Heyford Road at OS Grid Ref SP 5379 2554, south-eastwards across the Ardley Fields landfill site, the roundabout and lake at the Ardley Energy Recovery Facility to Ardley Br 26 and Middleton Stoney Br 6 at SP 5443 2514 **to** a new 1060m line running outside the Ardley Energy Recovery Facility site perimeter from 12m east of the B430 opposite its junction with the Upper Heyford Road at SP 5379 2554, south-south-westwards across the site's haul road entrance to SP 5373 2522 and which continues east-south-eastwards to SP 5434 2509 then east-north-eastwards north of Dewars Farm Quarry for approximately 739m to SP 5443 2514 where it joins Ardley Br 26 and Middleton Stoney Br 6 as shown on the Order plan.
