

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF ORDERS  
A PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER AND  
A PUBLIC PATH CREATION ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT  
MODIFICATION ORDER  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

- 1. The Oxfordshire County Council, West Hendred Unrecorded Bridleway Public Path Extinguishment Order 2021.**
- 2. The Oxfordshire County Council, West Hendred Bridleway No. 23, Public Path Creation and Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2021.**

On 17<sup>th</sup> March 2021, the Oxfordshire County Council confirmed the above Orders under s118 and s26 of the Highways Act respectively.

The effect of the Extinguishment Order as confirmed is to extinguish the 544m length of unrecorded bridleway at West Hendred running from West Hendred Byway 11 and Bridleway 17 at OS Grid Ref SU 4545 8838, south-south-eastwards to SU 4547 8830, south-south-westwards to SU 4542 8805 and then southwards to West Hendred Byway 9 at SU 4543 8785 as shown on the Order map.

The effect of the Creation Order as confirmed made is to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding a 650m length of bridleway running from West Hendred Br 17 at SU 4529 8833, south-south-eastward along field-edge to SU 4536 8808, continuing south-westwards to SU 4533 8805, westward to SU 4531 8804, southward along track beside 'Park Hill Row' to SU 45305 87728, south-south-eastwards to east side of track beside field gates at SU 45308 87723 and southward to West Hendred Byway 9 at SU 4530 8771 as shown on the Order map. The width of the bridleway will be 4m between SU 4529 8833 and SU 45305 87728 and 3m between SU 45305 87728 and SU 4530 8771.

The Orders came into force on the date of confirmation but if any person aggrieved by the Orders wants to question their validity, or that of any provision contained in them, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 (the Act), as amended, and/or the powers of section 53A of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (WCA) or on the ground that any requirement of either Act or of any regulation made under them has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act and as applied by s53A(7) WCA, **within six weeks from 25<sup>th</sup> March 2021** make an application to the High Court.
