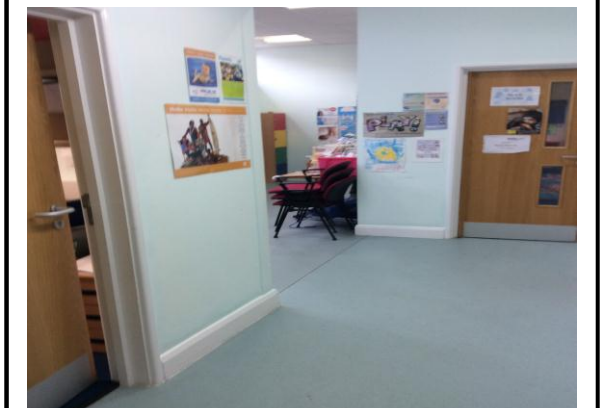

Achieving Economic Wellbeing	Information and advice provided to parents and carers to support them into employment and/or training. This includes advice on benefits, debt management and child care options. It is provided throughout all children's centre activities and on a one to one basis	632
Adult Services	Activities that are for adults only. This would include training courses aimed at adults returning to work	568
Ante-natal support	Activities that specifically provide ante natal support to pregnant women	104
Breastfeeding Support	Activities that provide breast feeding support e.g. breast feeding peer support, health visitors breast feeding advice session	681
Child Involvement	Activities that specifically involve children in decision making or consultations	38
Community Healthcare	Activities and drops in runs by health visitors, midwives and other health professionals	662
Dad's groups	Activities that are specifically for dads/fathers/male carers – they could be for fathers only or for fathers and their children	240
Crèches	Activities that take place in facilities that provide occasional care for children under 8, whilst parents or carers are engaged in other activities	209
Early Learning and Play	Activities that provide early learning and play opportunities for children under 5 years old with or without a carer present, where pre-booking is usually required	1986
Family Drop in	Drop-in activities open to all	6822
Health Lifestyle	Activities that support parents/carers/children to adopt a healthier lifestyle. These would include: dental advice, exercise, nutrition etc.	110
Outreach	Services / support provided in the home setting, where a family is receiving support from an outreach worker	139
Parenting Support	This activity is similar to outreach but delivered in the centre or other venue but not in the home. This does not cover formal parenting courses / sessions which are covered by parenting education programme	198

Play, Learning and Childcare	Activities run in partnership with other organisations to provide play and learning opportunities eg. Childminder sessions	358
Post-natal support	These activities involve parents and babies and could provide general support including drop in clinics or specific support other than breastfeeding	138
Safety	Activities that fall into this category would include provision of home safety advice such as fire prevention, first aid for parents/carers etc.	30
Special Needs Support	Activities and groups for children with disability and or special needs	175
Speech and language	Activities where speech & language services are delivered – usually for young children and typically with speech & language therapist or other specialist	177
